The other night I watched a fascinating NOVA program on PBS entitled "Farthest – Voyager in Space." It basically en-capsulized the history of the "Voyager Program" that started in the early1970's and still is being followed today by a select few number of scientists at NASA some four plus decades later. Its mission was two fold in nature.

First it was to give us earthlings a more complete a detailed understanding of the planets Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune, and their respective moons. It accomplished that task magnificently back in

the 90's, when its two satellites swung by each of those planets and were given a gravitational boost further into outer space beyond our solar system. Faint signals were still being received until just a few years ago.

That's when the second part of its mission came into play. On each of the voyager satellites they included a gold-plated long playing album with pictures of our species, where earth was in our solar system, plus the diverse music and languages we have, among other pertinent information about our species and the planet we inhabit. This information was put on these records with the hope that should there be any other life form out there in outer space they might discover that they too are not alone.

What intrigued me the most about this program was that scientists like most of us ask the same questions. How did I get here? Where did I come from? Is there a purpose in my being here at this time and place in our cosmos? These are the same question that both the Hebrews and others asked in Old Testament, and that Gentiles and Jews ask today. I know I've asked these same questions myself over time, as I have looked up into the heavens on a clear starlit night.

This month I had the opportunity to have a piano lesson with Lucille. What a treat to get some hints from such an accomplished player! However, I must say, one thing she told me I was not happy about...

rewind about 30 years when I was in the throes of my piano lessons. Mr. Baker insisted that we start each lesson with scales. It was also expected that as part of practice I would practice scales. For those of you are not musically trained, scales are the eight notes that form a key, like what Julia Andrews sang in Sound of Music when she broke out in "Doe a deer, a female deer; Ray a drop of golden sun, etc." Ms. Andrews made scales fun; but in real life, for this kid anyways, they are a horrible, tedious, progressions of notes. ...so what did Lucille tell me? To start each day of practice, and Sunday, with the scales in the keys of the respective songs for that week. UGH! Are you kidding me?!?!?! I'm so past scales...I've been playing for years...they are tedious...they aren't really music...you have got to be kidding me!!! But, I listened, took her advice and indeed (and admit a bit begrudgingly) can see improvement when I start with scales. It primes my brain, fingers and ears for the songs.

Then, later in the week when I was grumbling about sparing the few minutes in the morning to read my devotion and Bible, because I really did have better things to do (yeah, right!), it donned on me and I found myself asking the question, "why do I fight so hard against the very things that move me in the direction to maximize my potential?" And, the realization continued, it is not limited to playing scales and reading the scripture! GADS! Why is it so hard to get out the door to exercise? Why is it so hard to pick an apple over a bag of chips? Why is it so hard to clean the bathroom when Blue Bloods is on Netflix? Why can't I easily do the things that maximize my potential?

The good news is, I am not alone in this struggle, and this certainly isn't a 21st Century problem. Just read the passage above from Romans acknowledging the situation, and then the book of James and all the other instructional passages in the Bible that help us understand and overcome our "choice problem". It seems to be a human is equal to struggling with choices to maximize the potential that God placed in each one of us. *sigh*... It is reassuring to know that I'm "normal". Are you "normal" too?

The acknowledgement that we have a choice and a battle is raging at each decision point is an important first step. Then, we can celebrate as Christians that we can tap into the Holy Spirit to make it the choice that maximizes ourselves, and brings glory to God. I am learning to recognize the battle, and then boldly accept the opportunity for the Holy Spirit to win. The Holy Spirit doesn't "win" every time...yet. Devotions and scales are skipped, runs are missed, and the bathroom has remained dirty longer than it should. However, I believe the more I am aware and make an active-point to "get it done" more this week than last week, then I am on the right path. Join me in acknowledging and overcoming these challenges...give me a high-five when you "win" more than "lose" and let's maximize ourselves for God's glory.
