Sabbath



The fourth of the 10 Commandments is "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy."

The word Sabbath comes from the Hebrew verb Shabbat which means to rest from labor.

In Jewish practice, Shabbat begins at sunset on Friday and is begun with a meal filled with memory and symbolism. Part of the Shabbat service requires specific prayers over the bread and the wine.

This is the meal Jesus celebrated with his disciples and we remember by reenacting as The Lord's Supper. In this meal we remember the many good gifts God has given us and we pray over the bread and the cup just as in the Shabbat. You can see the through-line in the Shabbat Kiddush – the prayer prayed over the wine, which is similar to the prayer over the bread.

SHABBAT KIDDUSH

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, Creator of the fruit of the vine.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who finding favor with us, sanctified us with mitzvot (meaning commandments). In love and favor, You made the holy Shabbat our heritage as a reminder of the work of Creation. As first among our sacred days, it recalls the Exodus from Egypt. You chose us and set us apart from the peoples. In love and favor You have given us Your holy Shabbat as an inheritance.

Blessed are You, Adonai, who sanctifies Shabbat.

Certainly, our Sunday worship is part of the way we celebrate the Sabbath, but is that all there is to Sabbath? I think not.

In Genesis chapter 2 we learn that when God had finished creation, he rested. "Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all their multitude. And on the seventh day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation. (Gen. 2:1-3)

Rest is essential to a healthy life. Eugene Peterson commented, "If you don't take a Sabbath, something is wrong. You're doing too much; you're being too much in charge. You've got to quit, one day a week, and just watch what God is doing when you're not doing anything."

In our busy modern lives, to rest from all labor for an entire day is next to impossible. But setting aside a regular time for quiet rest with God is absolutely possible.

Mark Roberts of Fuller Seminary notes that "In the Gospel of Mark, [Jesus] made it clear that "the sabbath was made for humankind" (Mark 2:27). In other words, God created the Sabbath for our benefit. It is a gift for us, an opportunity for rest, refreshment, and renewal. The Sabbath is a time for us to refocus on God and God's purposes, as well as to enjoy God's many blessings."

He goes on to note how rare it is that followers of Jesus actually commit to a balance of work and rest. Even when we've finished our work-week, we fill any "free" time with activities.

Sabbath rest is necessary for not only our physical health, but also our spiritual health, and not just an hour on Sunday morning. Intentionally setting aside time to spend with God – even if it's only 10 minutes a day – will help you stay connected to God and will provide the Holy Spirit to work in you. Establishing regular times of Sabbath rest will refresh you and help you experience the renewing of your spiritual mind





Mission and Outreach

The Mission and Outreach Committee will pass on your donations to Head Start and Early Head Start through the TGIF Basket by the Church office and through the 2 Cents a Meal this quarter. Head Start and Early Head Start promote school readiness for economically disadvantaged children through educational, health, nutritional, social and other services. They serve 145 children from birth through age five and their families. GBC reports that 47 of the children currently enrolled are homeless. Especially this year of the pandemic, Head Start has helped feed these families and families that qualify but are not yet enrolled because of lack of space. The TGIF basket and the 2 cents a meal will help Head Start feed these families.

Head Start also has a Parents' Fund that helps with certain family needs such as with utility bills or other costs. If you would like to support this fund, mail a check to Head Start of NE Nevada with the "For" line stating Parent Fund. We don't often see how the pandemic has struck families in Elko because the mines have been able to keep operating, but the aching families are out there right in our own Elko.
