The Voller family arrived home from Denver on the 9th, before the snow on Monday and Tuesday! They have now received the results from the last bone marrow test done the day before leaving Denver. That test shows shows a very low percentage of leukemia cells left--they were hoping for zero. This puts Tristan in the high risk category so now rather than 4 weeks of very intense treatment he will have 8 weeks of such treatment. Lynn and I saw him on the 15th, and although it is very painful for him to walk he did slide off the sofa to retrieve a plastic bolt which had fallen on the floor from a tractor he was dissembling..(Great fine motor development toy!) He had not been able to do that small but very important motion the day before. Yes it is very hard to watch and refrain from help but you do because of love! Again and again, we all feel your power of prayer. Now we ask for even more strength for Chris, Ashlee, and Tristan as they move forward into this challenge of 8 very intense weeks of treatment. And by the way, just throw in that challenge that by the time you read this Tristan will have a new brother! So I guess extra prayers for Chris and Ashlee will be very appropriate!
