


### The Vine and The Branches



I "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. 2He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. 4Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. 5I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. 8My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. 9As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. 10If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love." (John 15:1-2, 4-5, 8-10)

We understand that God, the Father, is the owner/grower/planter of the vineyard. In that vineyard, there is one true vine: Jesus. He is the vine, and we are the branches. In order for branches to actually be able to grow grapes (bear fruit), they must be 1. Attached to the (true) vine, and 2. Be regularly pruned in order to bear more (good) fruit.



Cut a branch off of any fruit-bearing plant and see how much fruit of any kind that branch will grow. Yet, isn't that how many of us operate at least from time to time?

A branch (that's you and me) must be attached to Jesus, the vine (or trunk or stem) in order to receive the nutrients necessary for healthy growth and good results (good fruit).

So, how do we abide in Christ? Like so much of our life journey as followers of Jesus, it's simple, but it takes dedication and practice. It requires that we make our connection to Christ (the vine) a priority every day. Pastor and author, Voddie Baucham offers a pretty good road map. He says "1. Read your Bible, 2. Think Biblically, 3. Pray Biblically" (repeat daily).

Reading the Bible (the prophets – especially Isaiah as well as the Gospels) reveals that our Lord and Savior was a humble man. We really can come to know Christ by meeting him in the scriptures.

When we think biblically, we must know the teaching of Jesus; we must know what the Bible reveals about God's priorities. The prophets make it clear that God seeks an open heart, a heart willing to be transformed. Jesus also taught that throughout his ministry. God is interested in the surrendering of our hearts, understanding that true worship comes from an honest and repentant heart. Going through the motions is never enough.

Jesus summed up the Law and the Prophets in two commandments: Love God with all you are and love others in the same way you want to be loved. That requires us to learn how to emulate Jesus' humility.

When we think and pray biblically, we can recognize things about ourselves – in ourselves – that are not bearing any fruit – good or not. That means submitting to the pruning required if we are to bear good fruit that glorifies God. Pruning is pretty much guaranteed to be uncomfortable, but it's necessary. The good news is that we are always accompanied by the God who loves us enough to die for us, and who has never, and will never abandon us. The snipping may sting, but the fruit we will then bear for God will be glorious!


### The Mission and Outreach Committee


