

If you Google "different ways of prayer" you will find that there are four types, or five types, or even seven types of prayer.

Certainly, we practice liturgical prayers when we gather for worship. These are formal prayers to use in a congregational setting, written in order that we might join together in those prayers. We pray the Lord's Prayer as it is the one prayer Jesus gave to his disciples, and to us.

There is also a list to teach one the correct order in which to pray:

#### Learn How to Pray in These 4 Easy Steps

Step 1: Address the Heavenly Father.

Step 2: Thank the Heavenly Father.

Step 3: Ask the Heavenly Father.

Step 4: Close in the Name of Jesus Christ.

Additional instruction adds:

Pray always, with sincerity and with faith in Christ.

Prayers will always be answered.

(This is true but may be misleading. It might be misconstrued to make one think that the answer will be "yes" when the answer may be "no" or "wait.")

I don't find anything wrong with this list per se, but I think it has the potential to box a person into a pattern that may become rote rather than meaningful.

Without dismissing or negating the information above, I propose we think of our personal prayer lives in a different way. I suggest we think of our prayers as conversations – especially in the way we speak our prayers.

I've heard many people express their discomfort with praying aloud when with others, rather like we think all of us should be poets or biblical scholars.

What if we prayed to God in our natural ways of speaking, rather like talking with a friend or family member, for that IS what we are? We are adopted children of the living God, and Jesus says: "I do not call you servants any longer . . . but I have called you friends." (John 15:15)

When having conversations with your family members and friends, do you spend time trying to hone a perfect phrase? Or use language other than that which is part of your regular speech? I doubt it, and I hope not.

Prayer isn't simply us coming to God to make requests for ourselves or others. Prayer is intended to change us – it is part of our transformation in Christ.

I encourage you to talk to God, in your own words, with honesty and openness, just like you do with the people around you. Be bold to open your heart and tell God your hopes, your fears, your dreams, without looking for the "perfect" words.

Then listen. Wait upon God to impart peace to you. Allow yourself to experience God's presence and deep and abiding love for you.
